ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE A

On the Ballot of the Colusa County Water Conservation District

At the Advisory Election to be Held on November 3, 1987

Formation of Zone of Benefit No. 1 will not automatically result in the levying of any new taxes or assessments. No drainage projects can be selected or taxes assessed without future approval by a majority of the resident voters through a petition or an election.

However, formation of the Zone, which is a subdivision of the Colusa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, will provide a single unit within which people with a common interest can work to solve common problems.

The territory proposed to be included in the Zone encompasses most of the Colusa Urban Area. Its storm drainage flows eventually into the Colusa Basin Drain (2047 Canal). In the past, the east side of the City helped with its taxes to finance drainage improvements on the west side and is hoping the favor will be returned.

All use the streets, such as Bridge Street, which flood during the winter and will benefit from the solution of this problem.





An overall drainage solution is needed before Colusa can hope for normal growth. Patch-work solutions should be stopped because these quick fixes only aggravate the problems.

The proposed Zone will be governed by the Board of Directors of the District. That Board can be advised by a Zone Council composed of people residing within the Zone.

With formation of the Zone, the people can concentrate their energies on solving the drainage problems in the area and can have a greater opportunity to influence what is done in their Zone.

Your vote to advise the Board of Directors to form Zone of Benefit No. 1 will help make the entire Colusa community a better place in which to live and to earn a living.
